Dawes Road and Kelvin Avenue Watermain Replacement & Road Resurfacing

Expected Project Start Date: June 9, 2014

Expected Completion Date: July 31, 2014

As part of the Danforth Avenue Construction Project, the City of Toronto will be replacing the watermain and the City-owned portion of any substandard water services in order to improve the water distribution system and drinking water quality. In addition, road resurfacing work will also be completed after the completion of the watermain work.

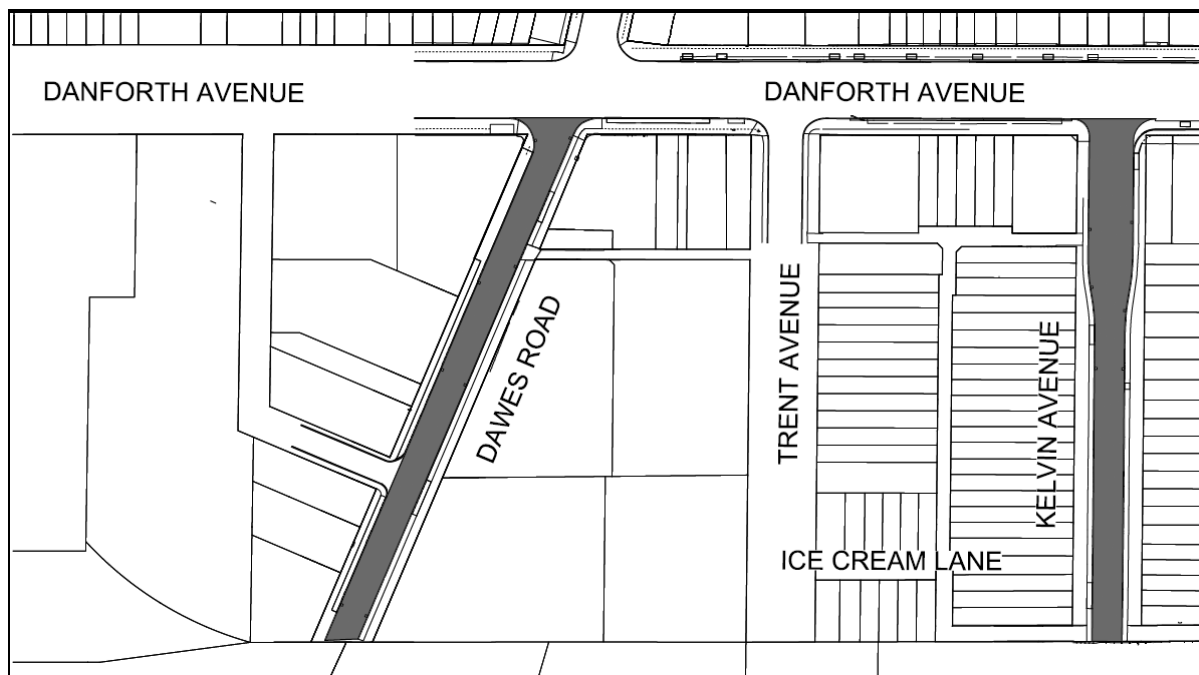
Work will be carried out on Dawes Road south of Danforth Avenue, and Kelvin Avenue. The work area is shown on the map below.

Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and appreciated.

Construction Notification

Regular updates will be provided to the community. The project is divided into staging work and the timeline of notification will be based on the progress and start-up of the individual stages. Notification for work on Danforth from Dawes to Victoria Park, and Luttrell Avenue will be distributed in the coming weeks.

Construction Details

The construction will involve the following work:

- Installation of new pipes;
- Disinfecting and flushing of the new pipes;
- Transferring water service connections from the old to the new watermains;
- Replacement of substandard water services on City property;
- Removing and replacing damaged concrete sidewalk and curbs;
- Removing asphalt and resurfacing Dawes Road and Kelvin Avenue and
- Restoring areas disturbed during construction.



Temporary disruptions to the water supply will occur during the construction period. Further notice will be given prior to any scheduled water supply disruption and residents/businesses will be informed if additional precautions are to be taken during the water supply disruptions.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00am to 7:00pm from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. These include lane restrictions on Dawes Road, south of Danforth and Kelvin Avenue. The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconveniences. Emergency (police, fire and medical response) and local access will be maintained at all times.

On-site signage will be posted to advise of detours, lane closures and pedestrian crossings.

Parking Restrictions & Allowances

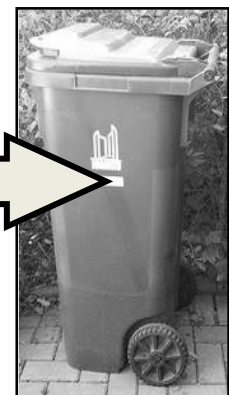
Construction may require temporary closure of private driveways and parking restrictions for short periods of time in the immediate area of watermain and water service construction. Further notice will be given prior to the temporary closures and alternative parking arrangements will be made if required.

On-street parking will be restricted during the daytime. Affected residents may park on adjacent side streets where it is permitted. Residents are advised not to park where on-street parking is prohibited. There will be no consideration for parking offences in areas designated as no parking.

Label Curbside Waste Collection Bins

Please continue to put out your garbage, recycling and green bins as per your normal schedule. If required, the contractor will temporarily move bins to an appropriate location and return them promptly.

Please write your address number in large print on the bins to ensure they are returned to the proper unit.

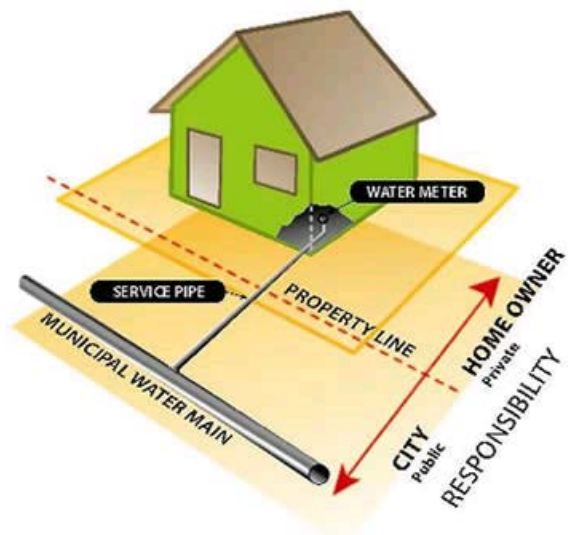
Boulevard Work

Property owners are advised that they may have to remove any unique landscaping and/or lawn sprinkler systems that are located on the City portion of their property before work begins, as well as delay improvements to driveways until construction is completed. If you have a lawn sprinkler system on the City portion of your property, please contact the Construction Inspector (information provided below) to arrange for a site inspection. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.

Substandard Water Service Replacement

A water service is the pipe that connects your home to the City's water distribution system to deliver water into your home. There are two portions to the water service – the privately-owned portion and the publicly-owned portion.

The privately-owned portion runs from the property line to the home and is owned by the property owner; the City-owned portion runs from the property line to the watermain and is owned by the City.



The City will replace the City-owned portion of any substandard water service connection discovered

during construction. The City is not responsible for replacing the privately-owned portion of the water service.

Your water service may be considered substandard if:

- the water service is made of lead or galvanized metal;
- the water service is smaller than the City's 19 mm standard size;
- it is a double service, delivering water to more than one residential property; or
- it is leaking or broken.

If you are considering replacing the privately-owned section of the service, it is recommended that you obtain at least three quotes from licensed contractors before deciding which company to hire. Property owners may contact the same contractor retained by the City (see below) to obtain an estimate for replacing the private portion of the water service at the same time as the public portion. PLEASE NOTE: any contract entered into is between the property owner and the contractor.

Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on replacement of lead pipes and potential health concerns.
